Exterior Tips:

- Keep sidewalks and patios clear of debris.
- Sweep garage and clean driveway.
- Power wash exterior of home if needed.
- Remove extra vehicles from view.
- Repair fences & gates.
- Remove holiday decorations.
- Replace/Repair/Paint any rotted wood or faded siding, shutters or window trim.

Interior Tips

- Clean all surfaces from top to bottom.
- Arrange and remove furniture to make rooms appear larger.
- Replace any burned out light bulbs.
- Discard dying house plants.
- Clear extra appliances & accessories from kitchen & bathroom counters.
- Polish sinks and remove stains.
- Clean appliances inside & out.
- Clean your cabinets & drawers.
- Replace soiled or worn shower curtains
- Clean out closets to show roominess.
- Straighten bookshelves & remove unnecessary items from coffee tables.
- Stage children's rooms to look fun & inviting.
- Clean all windows and tracks.



Tips for a Successful Showing

- Television & radio off.
- Pets & occupants should not be present for showings. Kennel your pet if unable to remove for showings.
- All drapes/blinds open and lights on for showings.
- Kitchen sink is free of dishes.
- Always keep your home show ready.
- Do not ever show your home to anyone who stops by unaccompanied by a real estate agent.







Compile Personal Records

Over the years you have acquired many personal documents that need to be safely stored and moved (medical records, birth certificates, financial and legal documents, driver's licenses, registrations, etc.). Begin gathering and organizing these items. Keep important documents with you while in transit to new location.

Start Packing
